
Eye Camp for Nakuru

Cycle and Electronics Limited is one of our biggest dealers based in Kisumu town. Mr Dinesh gives an overview of his business.

Where are you based?

We are in Kisumu town on Odera Street opposite Foam Mattresses.

Tell us about your business. What you do and how long?

Cycle & Electronic Services was started in 1985, inherited from our family business which started in 1947. Among the products we sell are bicycles, spares, Chloride Exide batteries, motorcycles, ox ploughs, generators, solar panels among others.

Why did you choose the name cycle and Electronics Services for your business?

We had two joint family business known as Deluxe Cycle and Deluxe Electronics. My brother Ramesh handled the bicycle section while I handled electronics. In 1985, we merged the two businesses and formed a partnership, hence the name Cycle and Electronics Services.

Do you offer after sales service to your clients?

Yes we do. We ensure all our customers are happy.

What is your association with C&G?

We have been selling C&G products since 1985. These include Briggs & Stratton generators and water pumps; and Suzuki and TVS motorbikes .

C&G Launches B&S Tillers

Car & General has introduced Briggs & Stratton range of agricultural tillers suitable for varied crops like rice, sugarcane, nursery crops, horticultural crops, maize and beans. C&G recognises the increasing importance of agriculture to meet the rapidly rising demand for food and the need for simple affordable farm equipment. The motorised tillers will save small farmers the extra cost of paying labour, or hiring a tractor.

The Garuda tiller range has a choice of five sizes. The base model is a 6.5 horse power petrol engined mini tiller with 12 blades best suited for intercrop weeding. This is ideal for farmers with small pieces of land

growing ordinary crops like maize and beans, or horticultural produce as it can be pushed easily through narrow spaces.

The top model is the super tiller 14 hp petrol engine which has 24 blades. This is larger and is designed for weeding between wider spaced crops like sugarcane, sisal, coffee and flowers on big acreages. The power tiller has a 12 hp water cooled direct injection diesel engine and is the most popular for fuel efficiency and more ground coverage while the master tiller is available in 10 hp petrol and 8.5 hp diesel models both highly suitable for intercrop weeding for cotton, sugarcane, banana and coconut cultivation.

Car & General Opens in Ndeeba, Kampala

Car & General has opened a TVS outlet in Ndeeba, Kampala. Located on Masaka Road the showroom is headed by Florence Tamar Kairangwa. Our journey towards being closer to customers on every street, in every town has started in earnest - we will get there!





Heat Exchanger and

Car & General (Kenya) Limited has installed a large 1.5 million shilling heat exchanger in the Cummins High Horsepower Engine Rebuild Centre in Lusaka Road to speed the testing of customers' engines.

The heat exchanger works on the same principle as a car radiator. Hot water from the cooling system of the engine under test enters the top of the heat exchanger and trickles down through a heat resistant plastic honeycomb. The cooling of the water is also aided by an integral fan attached to the heat exchanger which pushes air in the opposite direction to the water flow. By the time the water reaches the bottom of the heat exchanger there has been a significant drop in temperature and the water returns to the cooling system of the engine undergoing a dynamometer check.

The company has also installed a 4.2 million shilling Rotajet D108 washing machine to the equipment at the Rebuild Centre. Cleaning engine parts by hand is labour intensive and time consuming. The acquisition of a washing machine will speed the work of our technicians while hundreds of parts are being cleaned. The load capacity of the new washing machine is 2,500 kilogrammes and a mix of water and Neospray chemical is used to wash the engine parts. The machine has upper and lower revolving arms with jets that spray the cleaning agent at a pressure of five to six bar and at temperatures of 70 to 80 degrees centigrade.


Car & General at the **Naivasha Horticultural Show**
